Hi Mary and Laura,

I would like to request permission to apply for a Comprehensive Opioid Abuse Site-based program grant administered through the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance to support an Opiate Overdose Outreach project. If the proposal is successful, the funding will support Provoking Hope's outreach to individuals who have been administered naloxone and engage them in recovery-oriented peer delivered services and behavioral health treatment services. In addition, the program will fund a research component to undertake a systematic analysis on opioid overdose and naloxone administrations to ensure program decisions are responsive to service demands and consistent with resources. If approved, the grant request will be for \$300,000 for three years with an anticipated start date of October 1, 2017.

The project uses a collaborative team approach and includes law enforcement, emergency medical responders, local hospital emergency departments, along with our subcontractors, Provoking Hope, George Fox University and a Portland State University research partner. If funded, it will build upon an existing community coalition that is strong.

If our grant application is successful, I will return to the Board to request approval for the amount awarded. Please let me know if you have any questions.
